
The AQCS brings together, trains and supports its members. It represents them and takes a stand in all aspects affecting their professional life. It also contributes to the development of the education system.

WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

The reputation of the Association québécoise des cadres scolaires will have skyrocketed in 2017 2018, thanks to the sustained involvement of our members and the many opportunities taken to highlight the work of school executives. We can all be proud of the results of the last few months!

The signing of the **salary adjustment agreement** culminated in years of representation by the AQCS. This meant adopting a more coherent, more balanced salary structure between school executives and the staff they supervise, as well as bonuses for all classes.

Our successful **inter-association partnerships** with the Alliance des cadres de l'État, the Association des cadres des collèges du Québec and the Association des gestionnaires des établissements de santé et de services sociaux have expanded our professional development offer. These partnerships even led to the creation of a post graduate microprogram in management with ENAP.

Our annual convention under the theme "Agility, the Linchpin of Leadership" attracted 375 participants giving them the opportunity to reflect on their adaptability and creativity in this ever-changing network. Our first recipients of the School Executive Emeritus Award, presented in partnership with ADIGECS and ADGCSAQ, were also honored at the convention.

Proof of the dynamism and commitment of our professional boards: our members have written **10 notices for the MEES**, to promote the position of the AQCS and the expertise of school executives. PD funding, the role of the Student Ombudsman, budget rules, school taxes, IT, and home schooling have, among other things, been addressed in these expanded publications, available at **www.aqcs.ca**. I warmly thank the members who have dedicated themselves to this endeavor.

Our Association is a **strong**, **credible and influential**

network. The assessment of the year 2017-2018 eloquently demonstrates this. And since you entrusted me with the presidency once again last June, I will have the chance to contribute to achieving the objectives set in our 2017-2020 Strategic Plan.

It's an honor to continue along this path with you.

LABOUR RELATIONS

Wage increases and more equitable working conditions

During the past year, important work has been done by the AQCS Labor Relations Department in the salary file, in collaboration with the other associations and the representatives of the Ministry and school boards, with the result of important adjustments to wage scales.

These adjustments result in salary increments of 1.5% in 2016, 1.75% in 2017 and 2% in 2018, to the benefit of management staff, as well as unionized staff.

Note that these adjustments were funded from the sectoral budget envelopes (3.5% of the payroll) that were the subject of an agreement on the overall remuneration between management and the Treasury Board Secretariat, in December 2016.

In terms of compensation, the progress made has allowed for some salary catch-up as well as the adoption of a more coherent and balanced salary structure between managers and the staff they supervise.

As for the other conditions of employment that were discussed, the purpose of the AQCS representations was to seek greater fairness in working conditions applicable to all school executives.

The Association is very proud of the amendments that will be made to the *Règlement sur les conditions de travail* [Working Conditions Regulations] as a result of its demands, particularly with respect to salary protection, where all executives will be subject to the same mechanism of salary readjustment, without time limits, from April 2019. For the AQCS, this is another victory, which will have required significant efforts at the discussion tables.

Remediation of the financial situation of the PPMP: the changes bear fruit

It should be remembered that management associations had to agree to make changes to the provisions of the Pension Plan for Management Personnel (PPMP) in order to ensure its sustainability, due to a \$1.8G deficit in the Pension Fund and a contribution rate of approximately 20% in recent years.

In consideration of the adoption of new provisions for plan members and a temporary annuity indexation freeze for retired executives, the government has agreed to invest significant amounts in the Pension Fund and to limit the possible increase in the contribution rate until 2022.

The changes are already having their effects, while the contribution rate has been reduced to 12.82% for the years 2018 and 2019. In addition, the Pension Fund now has a surplus of nearly \$700 million.

While the improvement in the financial position of the PPMP is to be welcomed, another challenge is facing management associations and the government, which have not yet reached an agreement on the issue of RREGOP-RRPE transfer costs. As this issue is likely to weaken the current consolidation of the PPMP, the parties have agreed to create a working committee to explore solutions.

Lastly, with respect to the coming into force of new provisions as of July 1, 2019, the AQCS set up a PPER pension estimation service that enabled more than 200 members to assess the financial impacts of changes to their pension, and thus shed light on their decision to retire.

Group insurance coverage for retirees

Despite the desire expressed by the members of the AQCS (and other management associations) for the termination of the group insurance plan for retirees of management staff in the public and parapublic sectors, the government has still not acted to put an end to this insurance plan.

Faced with the reluctance of retired executives over the age of 65 who wish to maintain the regime, the government preferred to favor the status quo and give itself more time to try to find a consensus solution among the different groups involved: active executives, executive retirees under 65 and retired executives over 65 years of age.

It should be noted that the problem lies in the large difference between the amount of premiums payable by retirees under the age of 65 and those who have reached that age. In fact, the premiums to be paid annually are in the order of \$5,600 (family status) for the executive who has not yet reached age 65, compared to just over \$1,200 for the executive 65 years and older, because they can subscribe to the public drug insurance plan.



These costs are increasing because of medical and pharmacological developments. This is why the AQCS cannot accept the status quo to persist in this file.

Also, strong from their grouping within the RACAR, last June executive associations asked and obtained from the Treasury Board Secretariat the establishment of a working committee whose mandate is to explore potential solutions developed by associations with the concern to reconcile the interests of active and retired executives.

Work done by the Professional Relations Committee

The Professional Relations Committee (PRC) includes members who are appointed annually at the General Assembly meeting in June. Among other things, the PRC has the mandate to identify, validate and prioritize collective labor relations issues.

During the past year, the PRC met on November 16, 2017, January 25, 2018 (conference call), June 14, 2018, and June 26, 2018 (conference call). The main topics of discussion of the committee were:

- Regulation governing the working conditions of school executives and works:
 - o New salary proposal
 - o Regulatory amendments
- Classification and compensation issues
- Issues with regard to the Pension Plan of Management Personnel (PPMP)
- Group insurance for active and retired executives
- Return to work for retirees

Winners

Gilles Cavanagh

Director of Material Resources Services and School Transportation and Secretary General – René-Lévesque SB



Mr. Cavanagh distinguished himself by proactive building management and excellence in school transportation management for which he has received, on 5 occasions, provincial awards from the Bus Carriers Federation. His strategic leadership is recognized on the municipal level, due to the fact that he has developed infrastructure sharing protocols, to benefit students. Mr. Cavanagh established a regional collective internet fiber network, and developed different policies, particularly for sustainable development.

Josée Duquette

Director of Educational Resource Service - Marguerite-Bourgeoys SB



Ms. Duquette has been an educational leader for over 30 years. Her team has won prestigious awards, including an OCTAS for the excellence of FabLab, digital fabrication at school, and the CNESST Grand Prize in Occupational Health and Safety for a guide on management support measures in schools related to complex or emergency situations. Among other things, Ms. Duquette has deployed the Center for Professional Expertise in Psychology and Speech-Language Pathology and a specialized school for high school students with behavioral problems. She developed and implemented the first ever Quebec public school program for the gifted and created a dozen repositories for complementary service staff.

Michel Savard

Director of Professional Development – De l'Estuaire SB



Mr. Savard has dedicated himself to creating bridges between general adult education and vocational training, in addition to getting involved in a family-school-community approach to support parenting skills. In the regional context of the forestry crisis, he used the expertise of his team to develop complementary training profiles related, among others, to the mining sector. His leadership led to the major renovation of a PD Pavilion and the establishment of a day-care center to help young parents return to school. He is working on a transportation network project giving local youth access to all of his school board's Professional development programs.

Recognition Award



The AQCS also awarded a Recognition Award to **Ms. Julie Larouche**, manager of the school transportation service of the Pointe-de-l'Île SB. The Recognition Award has been awarded since 2004, to highlight the contributions of a member for the outreach of the AQCS. Ms. Larouche is involved in various bodies of the organization: at the time of receiving her award, she was President of the PB of Transportation Services and Vice-President of the Pointe-de-l'Île Section. She has been active in the College of Professional Boards and the General Council of the Association, and has distinguished herself in the organization of the Convention and the professional development sessions for members.

Custom training offered for school executives

During 2017-2018, the Association des gestionnaires des établissements de santé et de services sociaux joined our inter-association partners, allowing us to expand our training offer and to communicate with a new network of 12,000 people. This pool of participants greatly facilitates the startup of different courses.

Postgraduate microprogram in public administration with ENAP

Following a survey conducted among members of the AQCS, the Alliance des cadres de l'État and the Association des cadres des collèges du Québec, ENAP developed a postgraduate microprogram in public administration. A cohort was formed in Montreal in the spring and two more were planned for the fall of 2018 in Montreal and Quebec City. Course selection was made according to the interests of the members surveyed. This microprogram will allow those who wish to continue their postgraduate studies at the ENAP in the short program, the DESS or the master's degree, to have three courses recognized.

A concern for the next generation

On May 30, 2018, the AQCS and the Association des cadres des collèges du Québec held a professional development day especially formulated for future managers. Professionals, teachers and support staff aspiring to a management position in a school board or college were particularly targeted. Thanks to the expertise of the managers of each network, participants were able to better understand the role of the manager, to reflect on their management career path and to interact with experienced executives. The 35 participants greatly appreciated the activity, which will be repeated in 2018-2019 in an enhanced formula.

Co-development, an interesting alternative

Inter-association group (AQCS-ACCQ) for managers

The six managers in this group found that, despite their different workplaces, the situations experienced bear great similarities. During their three days of co-development, participants witnessed a change in their professional identity and improved their professional effectiveness.

Group for communications managers

Since the co-development experience of 2016-2017 was conclusive, the AQCS re-proposed the establishment of a group with the PB of the General Secretariat and Communications Services. The five participants exchanged on different themes reflecting their professional reality and enriched their practices.

A working committee for secretariat executives and administration officers

Always anxious to meet the needs of all its members and in the pursuit of work initiated, the AQCS set up a committee to develop a training offer for secretariat executives and administration officers. It had been observed that the approximately 300 members holding such functions were distributed in almost all the professional boards and that these individuals participated little in the training sessions. The evolution and reflections of this committee will be most interesting.



Works of the Collège des commissions professionnelles (CCP)

Under the chairmanship of Mr. Benoit LeBel, the Collège des commissions professionnelles met twice, on October 16, 2017 and May 10, 2018. The members of the Collège discussed the professional development of the members and possible collaborations between the PBs. At the end of the meeting of May 10, 2018, the CCP members were very satisfied with the work accomplished and adopted the 2018-2019 Action Plan.

Works of the Professional Boards

The professional boards (PBs) regroup members of the same sector of activity. Their role is to promote the professional interests of members, to foster exchanges, to participate in the drafting of notices and briefs and to serve on various committees.

Here are some achievements for the PBs in 2017-2018. Their respective action plans can be consulted at **www.agcs.ca**.

• PB of School Organisation:

Contribution to the drafting of the AQCS brief in the context of the special consultations on Bill 144 (free educational services and compulsory school attendance).



Publication of articles about inspirational members and the distribution of three video vignettes on the following themes: the structure of the AQCS, the work of the PB and the benefits of participating in the PB Development Session.



- PB of Procurement Services: In collaboration with HEC Montréal, the beginning of an analysis of supply management practices with selected school boards to identify performance drivers.
- **PB of Financial Resources Services:** Contribution to the drafting of several AQCS notices on fiscal rules, and a notice on Bill 166 (Reform of the School Taxation System).
- PB of Human Resources Services: Contribution to AQCS notice on budget rules and conducting a survey on the evolution of recruitment of new resources (professional, teaching and support staff).

- PB of Material Resources Services: Preparation of an argument demonstrating that underfunding contributes to the building maintenance deficit (inventory of budget data related to human resources assigned to the management of material resources in SBs).
- PB of Educational Services: Participation in the drafting of AQCS notices (creation of the National Institute for Excellence in Education, home-schooling) and a survey of school principals to know their professional development needs.
- PB of Transportation Services: Creation of a committee to identify the main areas of improvement of Géobus and contribution to the notices on budgetary rules.
- PB of Information Technologies: Preparation of a report concerning the strategic positioning of IT departments in school boards and steps taken with the MEES to create awareness of IT needs of the network.
- PB of General, Vocational and Business Training: Drafting of two notices on professional development (PD) and holding of the 2nd joint TRÉAQFP and CPFGPE symposium on May 31 and June 1, 2018, at the Lévis Convention and Exhibition Center. Out of 361 registrations, 213 people were managers. During the conference, Ms. Élise Lacroix, Director of the Service régional de la FP en Outaouais (des Draveurs SB), received the Award of Merit. Her commitment to professional development has been recognized by her peers.
- PB of General Secretariat and Communications Services: Support for the drafting of two AQCS notices (Bill 144 and on the management of complaints in schools). During its annual session, the CPSSGC presented a Distinguished Manager Award to Ms. Cathy-Maude Croft, General Secretary and Deputy Director of the Human Resources Services of the Des Phares SB. The selection committee recognized Ms. Croft's rigour and continued commitment to the school system.

Committee for the Professional Development of Executives and Managers (CPCG)

After a more difficult year in 2016-2017 with regards to financing, we can say that the MESS has stabilized the situation in 2017-2018. In fact, the sums were paid according to schedule and we were able to ensure the financing of the various training activities within the prescribed deadlines. The balance sheet as at June 30, 2018 shows a balance of \$35,275.48. At the last meeting, the members of the CPCG agreed, with the authorization of the MESS, to allocate this sum to Phase 1 of the development of a Web tool called *Clic Gestion* [Click Management], which will allow school executives to take stock of their professional development. We thank the members of the College of Professional Boards for their dedication and time in achieving the goals of the CPCG.







