WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

Significant gains in 2016-2017

Total compensation agreement, adoption of Bill 105, relationships with the MEES and actors of the education system: the AQCS' achievements in 2016-2017 succeeded one another quickly! Our members, BOD and permanent staff can be proud of their accomplishments.

Labour relations

Negotiations with the Treasury Board Secretariat for the renewal of the work conditions of executives (a first, between the State and the different partners representing the executives) led to the signing of an agreement. Beyond this achievement, the AQCS was able to defend the gains of the Pension Plan for Management Personnel, while highlighting the sectoral problems specific to school executives. Salary adjustments were obviously agreed upon immediately thereafter. All in all, our organization initiated a mandate that it defined in its recent Strategic Plan: contribute to a new collective bargaining framework, to improve the work conditions of its members.

Expertise and credibility

We have increased our influence by spending time on monitoring, pooling our expertise, producing structuring notices and briefs (through the active involvement of our members) and representing our members in many forums. Among the concrete results obtained, let us mention the presence of service executives on the school boards' Resource Allocation Committees.

Moreover, our professional boards contributed to key advances regarding home schooling, complementary services to students with special needs in general adult education and vocational training, training-job matching, Quebec's Digital Strategy and the regulation on volunteer construction work in schools.

An associative power

The commitment and work of the members of the BOD, section councils, professional boards, various committees, Executive Director and staff at the head office contributed to our success.

These people helped the AQCS be a well-structured dynamic association that informs quickly and speaks on behalf of its members in a loud and unified voice. We want to thank each and every one of you for playing a part in the power of our association.

Mr. Rémi Asselin, elected President on June 16, takes the helm of a growing association, among actors involved in the continuous improvement of public schools. We are convinced that he will know how to guide the AQCS and lead us even further, with you by its side.

LABOUR RELATIONS

TOTAL COMPENSATION: AN AGREEMENT FOR EXECUTIVES

In December 2016, the Treasury Board Secretariat and associations representing the 28,000 executives of the public and parapublic sector reached an agreement on the total compensation of executives. In this agreement, the government agreed to give executives the following wage increases.

REVISION OF THE SALARY SCALES AND ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION

From April 1, 2015 to March 31, 2016	1% lump sum
From April 1, 2016 to March 31, 2017	1.5%
From April 1, 2017 to March 31, 2018	1.75%
From April 1, 2018 to March 31, 2019	2%
From April 1, 2019 to March 31, 2020	0.5% lump sum

SECTORAL ALLOCATION

In addition to the wage increases and in order to solve the "sectoral problems documented", an envelope representing 3.5% of the payroll was given to executives. This sum will be distributed as follows: 1.5% during the 2017-2018 fiscal year and 2% during the 2019-2020 fiscal year. For the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the associations presented a wage adjustment proposal aiming to solve the wage gap problem affecting classes 5 and 6 last June. We should get an answer by the fall of 2017.

REVISION OF THE REGULATION ON THE WORK CONDITIONS OF SCHOOL EXECUTIVES

Talks proceeded between labour and management representatives as part of the process to revise the Regulation on the work conditions of school executives. In terms of the budgetary issues regarding the costs linked to the requests made by associations, management representatives informed the associations that these costs would be funded from the sectoral allocation of 3.5% of the total payroll provided to executives. The work will continue throughout 2017-2018 based on the priorities identified by the associations.



CHANGES TO THE PENSION PLAN OF MANAGEMENT PERSONNEL

Regarding the Pension Plan of Management Personnel (PPMP), the associations agreed to make changes to it to ensure its sustainability, namely through the elimination of the \$1.8G deficit of the Pension Fund. To do this, the measures implemented will include a shared fiscal effort on the part of the government, active executives and retired executives. In exchange for the changes to the plan, the PPMP contribution rate for the 2018-2022 period will be equal to the current service cost, or what it costs to finance the retirement benefits to be paid during the year (without taking account the deficit). As an indication, the PPMP contribution rate in effect will change from 15.03% to 12.82% for 2018 and 2019, which translates into a 2.21% cost reduction. The new provisions are presented in the following table.

As for the retirees, **as of June 30, 2019**, they will contribute to the restructuring of the plan by having their pension indexation suspended for a period of 6 years, from 2021 to 2025.

To support members in their decision making when retiring, the labour relations team developed a pension estimate service, using a tool prepared by the Regroupement des associations de cadres en matière d'assurances et de retraite (RACAR) of which the AQCS is a member.

GROUP INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR RETIREES

The labour relations team consulted AQCS members last February on the relevance of maintaining the group insurance plan for management staff retirees from the public and parapublic sectors. Note that 82% of the 434 members who responded to the survey were in favour of putting an end to the insurance plan for retirees.

It is important to remember that, contrary to the group insurance plan of active members, the premiums of the contract for retired executives are totally borne by the participants. These premiums have continuously increased over the last few years and this trend should continue according to the forecasts, resulting in today's annual premiums amounting to \$5,500 (family status) or \$2,976 (individual status) until the age of 65. After 65, retired executives can decide to enroll in the public drug insurance plan, while maintaining some coverage with SSQ's complementary private plan (basic or enhanced).

Discussions are still ongoing with the Treasury Board Secretariat regarding the future of this group insurance plan and possible alternatives.



MAINTENANCE OF PAY EQUITY IN 2010 AND 2016

In March 2017, the school boards paid out the amounts owed as part of the 2010 pay equity maintenance process. For the executives concerned, the amounts were payable retroactively to December 31, 2010.

As for the 2016 pay equity maintenance process, it was the subject of joint work between the government and executive associations. For this work, the Committee came to the conclusion that there had not been any "systemic discrimination based on gender" since and that, as such, no salary adjustment was needed.

PAY SCALE RESTRUCTURING AS OF DECEMBER 30, 2016

Previous pay equity and pay equity maintenance processes led to the multiplication of pay scales because of the adjustments granted to certain job categories of school board and cegep executives. Such a multiplication of pay scales induced inconsistencies in the salary structure and classification plan. So, for a same job class, two executives could see a different pay scale applied.

Consequently, the parties agreed to review the pay scales applicable to executives to return to one single pay scale per job class (1-12), while ensuring compliance with the Pay Equity Act.

Enhanced pay scales as of December 30, 2016 apply to all school executives, whether they are targeted by pay equity and maintenance or not. Payments will vary depending on the percentages of salary adjustments applicable and the job categories. The value of these salary adjustments is equivalent to 0.48% of the payroll of school executives. This amount of 2.5 million dollars is added to the salary adjustments negotiated as part of the agreement made in December 2016. Payments retroactive to December 30, 2016, are expected in the fall of 2017.

WORK DONE BY THE PROFESSIONAL RELATIONS COMMITTEE

The Professional Relations Committee (PRC) includes members who are assigned yearly during the General Council in June. The PRC namely has the mandate to identify, validate and prioritize collective labour relations cases.

In 2016-2017, the PRC met on October 20, 2016 and March 23, 2017. The Committee mainly discussed the following:

- Issues regarding the Pension Plan for Management Personnel (PPMP)
- Revision of the Regulation governing the working conditions of school executives and work done on the sectoral allocation
- 2015-2019 wage increases
- Classification and compensation problems
- Group insurance for retired executives



PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

WORK DONE BY THE COLLEGE OF PROFESSIONAL BOARDS (CPB)

CPB members met three times over the last year. Various issues were dealt with, thanks to the involvement of the members.

- Sharing and discussing matters regarding the management of PBs (registration costs, surplus use conditions, implementation of a collaborative platform, consolidation and development of partnerships, professional development of school management, etc.)
- Adoption of the review of the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 Action Plans

Furthermore, it is important to highlight all the work accomplished by the different sub-committees implemented over the last year to support the professional boards, fostering collaboration and reaching the goals set out in the 2016-2017 Work Plan.

TRAINING OFFERED TO SCHOOL EXECUTIVES

- **Inter-association partnerships for development**

A new management development offer was created in partnership with the Association des cadres des collèges du Québec (ACCO) and Alliance des cadres de l'État. Three training sessions were thus offered in the fall of 2016 and winter of 2017, including two in remote areas. The positive response from managers, reflecting the importance granted to the development of their skills, pushes us to pursue this inter-association partnership and extend it to other partners in 2018.

- **Professional co-development groups**

In the fall of 2016, two pilot co-development groups were set up to see if this development method met the needs of members. Co-development is an approach that builds on discussions between participants to improve their comprehension of issues and problems and enhance their strategies.

- **CPSSGC communication executives**

Eight communication managers were steered by a facilitator during the year. Their experience was a positive one: pooling situations and practices was a very interesting aspect according to them. The participants recommended offering this formula again.

- **AQCS-ACCO group on material resources**

This inter-association group composed of eight coordinators or directors (four from the college system and four from the education system) shared solutions regarding concrete work-related problems. Although the participants noticed cultural differences between the school boards and cegeps, they deemed having benefitted from their contact with others, not only in terms of material resources, but also regarding professional skills. The members wished to repeat the experience.

SUMMARY OF THE WORK ACCOMPLISHED BY THE PROFESSIONAL BOARDS (PB)

PBs include members from the same sector. Their role is to promote the professional interests of members, foster exchanges, participate in the drafting of notices and briefs and serve on various committees.

- **Joint seminar with the TRÉAQFP for general adult education, vocational training and business training**

This is a great achievement for the seminar held in May at the Lévis Conference and Exhibit Centre. Record participation and satisfaction levels, both from our members (230 managers) and TRÉAQFP participants, was noted. In addition to the high-quality conferences and workshops, participants appreciated the numerous networking and discussion opportunities. Another seminar was thus planned for the end of May 2018.



- **2017 CPSSGC Emeritus Manager Award**

The PB of General Secretariat and Communications Services gave its Emeritus Manager Award to Mr. Marc Soucie, Director of the School Transportation and General Secretariat Service at the Appalaches SB on April 27, 2017. Mr. Soucie is very committed to the General Secretariat Services' Central and Eastern Quebec Regional Committee. He was also involved with the AQCS CPSSGC for several years, including three as President. He is President of the Eastern Quebec school board consolidation for insurance. Mr. Soucie helped draft notices and briefs and played a major role in the negotiations surrounding the management of copyrights and audiovisual licenses.



EXECUTIVE AND MANAGER DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE (CPCG)

A late grant

It is only in May 2017, instead of fall 2016, that the MEES paid a grant to the CPCG to train executives. During the wait, CPCG members decided to increase the amounts that can be granted to managers, in order to fully use the forthcoming budgetary envelope. The CPCG deemed that it was impossible to make a second call for grant applications given that the deadline was too tight.

Let us specify that the CPCG management rules are now governed in a financial agreement with the ministry. It includes terms and conditions regarding payment of the grant, use of non-committed amounts, CPCG promotion rules, etc.

PUBLIC AND GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

OUR POSITION

How does the AQCS build its arguments? Through close collaboration with its professional boards, sections and committees. Their recommendations and expertise are at the basis of our association's interventions.

- **MEES-Partner Committee**

Created in February 2017 as part of a collaborative approach by Deputy Minister Sylvie Barcelo, this committee includes the presidency of the AQCS and representatives from the different actors of the network (FCSQ, FCPO, ADIGECS, etc.) and discusses issues related to education. Five sectoral sub-working groups helped to boost the AQCS' visibility:

- **Budgetary rules**

- **Financial regime**

- **Support in the implementation of legislative provisions**

Mr. Jean-François Parent, Executive Director and Mr. Érick Parent (substitute, CPSSGC)



- **Parliamentary Committee on Bill 105**

On a proposal from the AQCS, the mandatory participation of school executives on the school boards' Resource Allocation Committees was included in Bill 105 amending the Education Act, sanctioned on November 23, 2016.

- **Academic Success Policy**

The AQCS played an active role in various components of the Minister Sébastien Proulx' public consultation on this project. A committee prepared a substantive brief, presented by the President and Executive Director during the National Academic Success Days, in December 2016. The Academic Success Policy was launched on June 21, 2017.

- **Budget lock-up**

For the first time, the AQCS was invited to participate in this exercise, allowing it to read the budget before its public filing. Our five representatives discussed with the office of the Minister of Education and Higher Education, Mr. Sébastien Proulx, the deputy ministers and actors of the education system. They formulated requests regarding the relaxation of the budgetary rules and more flexibility in the use of dedicated envelopes.

- **Fédération des commissions scolaires du Québec**

The executive management and presidency led consultation meetings with the FCSQ on different issues including development and Quebec's budget. Representatives from our professional boards also joined committees created by the FCSQ: one regarding the National Labour Get-Together (two CPFGE members) and the other to draft a brief on Quebec's Digital Strategy (two CPTI members).

- **Media**

Numerous interviews were given over the last few months, to support the view of the AQCS on major educational issues. The solution proposed by our association on correction biases was namely the subject of an article.






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
